

### **PASTOR'S NOTE**





When I arrived here at St. Joseph back in July 2011, there were five Sunday Masses (including the Saturday vigil). I had regular help from other priests, so it was a manageable load, thankfully.

Many of you will recall that the schedule for our

first three Sunday Masses was 8:15am, 10:00am and 12:00pm. I remember thinking: 8:15am? Why not either 8:00am or 8:30am? My thought was that when telling a visitor or new parishioner the schedule, it's not as easy to remember irregular Mass times. I consulted folks, such as the Pastoral Council and Liturgy Commission, and thought of changing it to either 8:00am or 8:30am, but honestly I feared upsetting folks, believing that people are deeply wedded to "their Mass time."

I also recall several years ago, raising the question at the morning Masses, of potentially adjusting times, in hopes that it would better distribute attendance across Masses and thus hopefully alleviate some of the shortage of parking issues. The few responses I received after Mass were something like this: "It makes sense, Father, but just don't change this Mass time."

And so it never changed.....that is, until the pandemic. We went from 5 Sunday Masses to zero public Masses in an instant. Over the many, many months that we gradually redeveloped our Mass schedule, from the start of it, I knew I didn't want to simply go back to the pre-pandemic schedule, merely on the basis that it is what we did before.

The rebuilding of the Mass schedule taught me (and us) that we are not only resilient, but also that we can adjust. Since then, we've tried to be thoughtful about any tinkering that we've made to the schedule, to consult and to communicate any changes in advance. And overwhelmingly, you've all been understanding. Thank you.

Now that our Mass attendance numbers have risen to where they are now, if I were to continue here as pastor, I would likely revisit for the fall, whether the current schedule is best. Slight tweaking might help to move some people off of the 11:00am Mass to an alternative time. The reason is that we tend to run out of parking at that Mass.

But I'm not going to be here. And more than just the 11:00am parking woes, we are now part of a family of parishes that currently has 3 priests serving 9 Sunday Masses. But as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, this family will only have 2 priests. Thus, 9 Masses (at 3 locations) is not sustainable.

I'm consulting with Pastoral Council, Fr. Oakland (the incoming pastor) and the Archdiocese about options. We will keep you apprised. Please pray for workable solutions (there are workable solutions), and please be open to these inevitable changes.

#### 2024 IN SPOKANE—REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS JUNE 22


